



A. Using a very hot large barrel curling iron, hold the section up straight from the head and roll as shown. Pull on the iron firmly to get a crisp curl. Immediately after removing the iron, roll the section and clip into place. Spray while warm to seal the curl. Allow the set to rest and cool before removing clips.



B. Teasing this much is scary I know...but it is important for this look! Trust yourself and assure your client this is a necessary step! Base tease close to the scalp very important to keep its shape. Use a teasing comb, not a brush for the best teasing.

C. Begin smoothing out the top and sides with a bristle brush that will not pull out the teasing. Avoid using too much hair spray, rely on the teasing. Light spraying is ok.



D. Begin shaping the look, starting with the sides and working with small sections. It is more like pinching and pushing the sections to the head to maintain texture. Don't over brush or flatten this look. Step away often to view your work.

F. Continue working around the front as shown. Trust yourself, you can do this look yourself as well, just practice!!



Allow the sections to be random and creative.

Shape the ends by pinching them and placing them where you want them.
